In presenting the report, Councillor Nigel Ball, Cabinet Member for Public Health, Leisure and Culture stated that the South Yorkshire Joint Advisory Committee on Archives provided a basis for the storage, facilitation and benchmarking of archives and paper. The Joint Advisory Committee provided a county wide approach for the creation and maintenance of South Yorkshire archives holdings and allowed Members from each designated area to provide updates and share best practice examples. The group meets quarterly.

The Mayor sought clarity as to what percentage of the group's funding came from Doncaster Council and what elements were used by the Council. The Mayor was keen to ensure that the Council was obtaining value for money.

2. DECISION TAKEN

Cabinet noted the feedback and comments in respect of the Council's partnership arrangements with the Joint Committee for South Yorkshire Archaeology.

3. REASON FOR DECISION

Councillor Nigel Ball, Cabinet Member for Public Health, Leisure and Culture presented a report which provided an overview of the objectives, key activities undertaken during 1st April 2017 to 31st March 2018, future key activities expected to be undertaken during 1st April 2018 to 31st March 2019, significant governance issues and other issues in relation to the Joint Committee for South Yorkshire Archaeology.

Councillor Nigel Ball reported that the South Yorkshire Joint Advisory Committee on Archaeology provided a basis for a combined South Yorkshire County approach that offered advice to the four local authorities on archaeological finds. The Joint Advisory Committee was working effectively with planning, developers and land managers in relation to safeguarding the Borough's current history. The Joint Advisory Committee provided for the recording and management of its current finds within the Borough's natural environment. The South Yorkshire Joint Advisory Committee on Archaeology also provided advice, guidance and information in relation to appropriate steps needed to protect land sites and artefacts. Members noted that this work was performed at quarterly meetings where representatives from each of the four designated South Yorkshire local authorities were presently represented.

In commenting on the report, the Mayor spoke of the need to ensure that the Joint Committee for South Yorkshire Archaeology continued to demonstrate value for money for the Council.
