Our Approach

In our strategy 'Caring for the Future' we have set out how we will approach our work to support carers. Here are the principles we have agreed. We will work within these principles as we put this plan into action.

- Organisations will work in partnership to add value to their individual actions.
- Families who are caring will be involved as equal partners in developing the strategy and holding us to account regarding its delivery.
- We will seek out and use best practice in what we deliver and how we deliver it. The strategy will be made real through action plans with clear timescales and ways of measuring their success.
- The strategy will develop and adapt over time so that it always reflects what is most important and useful to carers at all ages and stages of life.
- We will not wait for problems to arise but will plan ahead. We will try new approaches and build on what works.
- We will promote independence and work to prevent any current needs from getting worse.
- We will focus on the person, whether they are giving or receiving care, to build on their strengths and make the most of their resources.
- As organisations we will be efficient, focused on quality and hold ourselves accountable to our local community.
- We will work together with carers to achieve the outcomes they are looking for.
