# 2. <u>MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 13TH MARCH, 2015</u>

#### 4. <u>FINAL INTERVIEWS FOR THE POST OF DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC</u> <u>HEALTH (EXCLUSION PARAGRAPH 1).</u>

The Committee received a report to inform of the arrangements made for the final interview process to the post of Director of Public Health.

Members were advised that following the short-listing of 2 candidates for the post, 1 candidate had withdrawn from the final interview stage and therefore only 1 candidate would be interviewed for the post. The Chair requested reassurance that the interviews could still continue with one candidate. The Assistant Director of Human Resources and Communications confirmed and re-iterated the advice provided at the short-listing meeting, that applicants are assessed against the essential criteria requirements included in the job specification. Where this criteria is met then candidates can be formally considered for the post. There is no minimum number of applicants required.

Both the representatives from Public Health England (on behalf of the Secretary of State for Health) and the Faculty of Public Health Technical Assessor, who were required to be in attendance to advise on this joint recruitment appointment, also provided their assurance that the remaining candidate did indeed meet the essential criteria and should still be considered for the post.

<u>RESOLVED</u> that RS be appointed to the post Director of Public Health subject to formal ratification by the Secretary of State for Health on this joint appointment.
