EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 1. This report gives a brief outline of the Safer Stronger Doncaster Partnership priorities in 2014-15, contained within the Community Safety Strategy (see appendix A). The content of this report and priorities have been considered by a range of groups and agencies within and external to the Council.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR THE CITIZENS OF DONCASTER?

- Community safety is one of the Council's key priorities. The specific priorities for the Safer Stronger Doncaster Partnership have been identified through the production of the Joint Strategic Intelligence Assessment and refreshed accordingly. The priorities have been identified as:
 - a. Protecting vulnerable people;
 - b. Reducing crime, anti-social behaviour and re-offending; and
 - c. Reduce substance and alcohol misuse and the associated effects on crime.

Adopting this strategy will provide a framework for the Council to guide its partnership activity to reduce crime and disorder and improve community safety over the period 2014-2017.

BACKGROUND

The Community Safety Strategy is a Statutory Plan and to meet the requirements of the Council's budget and policy framework, there is a requirement for consideration of this document by full Council.

OPTIONS CONSIDERED

7. To support the community safety strategy, not to do so would mean not complying with legal requirements.

8. The community safety strategy will inform the local authority's priorities and ensure the service meets the requirements for all communities within the borough.
