#### 1.0: SUMMARY

- Violent, Drug and Public Order offending in the Op ALLIGATOR area reduced by over 50% in the 6 months to September 2010 compared to the same period during the 2009.
- In 2009 offending increased in July and continued to rise in September.
- The trend in offending is upwards for both time periods. However, following an increase in July and August 2010, offending fell in September.
- Offending in the Cumulative Impact Zone represented 53% of all offending in the Op ALLIGATOR area in the 6 months to September 2010. This compares to 59% of offending in the corresponding period in the previous year.
- Offending in the Cumulative Impact Zone fell significantly vis-a-vis the corresponding period in 2009, However, the current trend is slightly upwards. This trend is skewed by a sharp rise in offending in August, possibly linked to a seasonal increase in outside drinking. Offending fell in September 2010.
- ASB in the Op ALLIGATOR area rose slightly over the 6 months to Sep 2010. However, incidents in the Cumulative Impact Zone fell slightly over the same period.

#### 2.0: OFFENDING IN THE ALLIGATOR AREA

- Violent, Drug and Public Order offending during the evening economy fell by over 50% in the 6 months to September 2010 compared to the same period during the 2009. Table 1 gives the figures per month, which are also shown pictorially in Graph 1.
- Graph 2 shows the trends in offending during the 6-month period April to September in 2009 and
- Graph 2 highlights the reduction in offending in 2010 compared to 2009. Offending in the 2 periods increased overall. This chart highlights:
  - A peak in May 2009
  - Offending converged in July through an increase in 2010 and a decrease in 2009.
  - From July 2009 offending continued to rise, whereas in 2010 the increase was less severe and started to fall in September.







These charts show that the trend for Public Order/Common Assault, Drug and Violence With Injury offences is upwards. For Sexual and Serious Violent offences the trend is consistent. NB: There was only 1 Robbery offence during this 6month period.


### 3.0: OFFENDING IN THE CUMULATIVE IMPACT ZONE

- There were 175 offences in the Cumulative Impact Zone during the 6 months to September 2010. This
  represents 53% of all offending in the Op ALLIGATOR area.
- In the corresponding period in 2009 offending in the Zone was 59% (416 offences) of all offending in the Op ALLIGATOR area.
- Table 3 gives these offences by month for each of the 5 streets in the Zone. This is represented
  pictorially in Graph 4. NB: All streets show a decrease in offending.
- Graph 5 shows the trend in offending comparing 2009 and 2010, for the 6 months to September 2010.



- Although offending in the Cumulative Impact Zone has fallen significantly vis-a-vis the corresponding period in 2009, the current trend is slightly upwards. However, this trend is skewed by a sharp rise in offending in August, possibly linked to a seasonal increase in outside drinking. The spike in offending in August 2010 was reversed in September.
- Table 4 gives the offences committed in the Cumulative Impact Zone during the 6 month period to sep 2010. This data is shown pictorially in Graph 6






## 4.0: ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR


- . There were 626 ASB incidents in the Op ALLIGATOR area during the 6 months to September 2010.
- The trend for this period is slightly upwards. (see Graph 7).
- 132 (21.1%) of these incidents were in the Cumulative Impact Zone.
- The trend in ASB in the Cumulative Impact Zone is downwards over the 6 months to Sep 2010. (see Graph 8)
