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*Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions***Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol**

Where a premises licence authorises the supply of alcohol, the licence must include the following conditions.

- 1) The first condition is that no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
 - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

- 2) The second condition is that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

- 3)
 - (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children-
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-

- (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters of flyers on, or in the vicinity or, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 4) The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5) The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6)
 - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 7) The responsible person shall ensure that-
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
 - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Mandatory condition: exhibition of films

- 1) Where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the licence must include a condition requiring the admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with this section.
- 2) Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection (3)(b) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that body.
- 3) Where-
 - a) the film classification body is not specified in the licence, or
 - b) the relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question. Admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.
- 4) In this section-

“children” means persons aged under 18;

and

“film classification body” means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c30) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

Mandatory Condition: door supervisor

- 1) Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, the licence must include a condition that each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- 2) But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed-
 - a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or
 - b) in respect of premises in relation to-
 - (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
 - (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).
- 3) for the purpose of this section-
 - a) “security activity” means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and
 - b) paragraph 8(A5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

*Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with your Operating Schedule***General - all four licensing objectives:-**

It is considered that the existing conditions and operating procedures already sufficiently promote the licensing objectives and we refer to the justices on licence, special hours certificate and public entertainment licence.

The Protection of Children from Harm:-

Children shall not be permitted in areas of the premises that would enable them to view tableside dancing or entertainment of a like nature being performed.

Striptease/Pole/Lap Dancing Conditions:-

- 1) The striptease/entertainment (lap dancing) shall be given only by the performers/entertainers and the audience must remain fully clothed.
- 2) The performance must not be visible from the street.
- 3) Except with the consent of the council no external advertising of the striptease/lap dancing shall take place at the premises or in its immediate vicinity.
- 4) All performers shall be aged 18 or over
- 5) When the premises are open for striptease/lap dancing no person under the age of 18 shall be allowed on the premises.
- 6) Customers must be informed prior to lap dancing commencing of the following rules:-
 - a) No touching must take place during dances.
 - b) Customers must remain seated during dancing.
 - c) Customers must leave the area as soon as the dance has finished.
- 7) Lap dancers must not:-
 - a) Open their legs when completely undressed.
 - b) Dance for longer than 1 minute when completely undressed.
 - c) Show their genitals.
 - d) Sit on customer's laps (dry ride).
- 8) On completion of the dance, dancers must:-
 - a) Ask the customer to leave the area immediately.
 - b) Dress themselves immediately.
 - c) Dancers must not leave the dance area in a state of undress and must dress in accordance with club regulations.
- 9) If requested by a customer for a further dance the dancer must:-
 - a) Put their undergarments (briefs) and or top back on.
 - b) Receive payment only by way of dance tokens.
- 10) Podium dancers must not:-
 - a) Entice dancers onto the podium.
 - b) Remove their undergarments.
 - c) Interfere with their undergarments in such a way as to show their genitals.

- d) Receive gratuities other than in their garter belts or by hand.
- 11) Sex toys must not be used and penetration of the genital area by any means must not take place.
- 12) Dancers must not solicit, exchange addresses or telephone numbers with customers or liaise with customers off the premises.
- 13) When dancers leave the premises they must be escorted to their cars or taxi by another staff member.
- 14) A minimum of 2 registered door staff will be used when the premises are open.
- 15) These conditions are imposed in addition to the standard Premise Licence Conditions with which the Licensee must comply.
