#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

- Locality working involves the whole Council pulling together with partners to deliver on local 'deals' and Locality Plans that have been produced 'with' and 'by' residents – not 'to' or 'for' them. Locality working means more decisions about priorities are made and influenced locally, with residents at the heart of this.
- 2. This report provides practical examples of the locality model "on the ground" in terms of the impact it is having on our communities and the issues that are important to them.
- 3. The presentation accompanying this report provides a more in depth example from each locality, covering different dimensions of locality working from health and wellbeing to economic inclusion to community safety to a better start for children and young people. The presentation also describes how the Council and partners are improving engagement with communities, reaching a greater number of people from a more diverse range of backgrounds.



#### WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR THE CITIZENS OF DONCASTER?

6. Locality working will improve resident experience through a more locally informed, integrated and relationship focused approach. It will reduce the need for crisis response through a more preventive, integrated approach. It will support inclusive growth across the Borough by removing barriers to inclusion and connecting people and places to economic opportunity, including those facing greatest disadvantage.

#### **BACKGROUND**

7. Locality working focuses on four key interdependent areas of change (work-streams) as outlined in the diagram below:




- 8. Fundamental design features of the project, embedded throughout are:
  - i) An emphasis on a relationship based, Asset Based Community Development approach – building capability and releasing the inherent strengths of individuals, families and communities and of front-line workers.
  - ii) A shift to 'Whole Family Working', ensuring that all Council services work together with partners to take a whole family, community centred, strength-based approach to how issues are addressed, rather than one based on 'presenting symptoms'. This will enable more focus on root causes and drivers of the challenges that individuals, families and communities can face.
  - iii) An intelligence led, proportional approach, targeting and adapting responses to local strengths, needs and dynamics i.e. not a 'one size fits all' approach.
  - iv) Locality Plans, launched in August 2022, are the product of local engagement and co-design with residents and tie the above actions together so that there is a local deal for each of our communities that reflects their needs and aspirations. Locality plans look at how we can work together to strengthen communities and improve the lives and opportunities for the residents living there.

#### Locality working in action

- 9. The four Locality areas of North, East, South and Central (publicly launched in August 2022), work together and independently to improve outcomes for the community and quality of life across all of Doncaster's towns, villages and communities, reflecting the identity, character and social and economic circumstances of each local place.
- 10. The model is based on four pre-existing large locality footprints that have the advantage of being coterminous boundaries with several key partners (St Leger Homes, Doncaster Integrated Care Partnership (ICP), Primary Care, South Yorkshire Police).
- 11. Within the Central Locality there is a specific focus on the Urban Core/Centre i.e. Doncaster City Centre and the immediate surrounding residential areas. This reflects the specific characteristics, dynamics, opportunities and challenges in this area, and extending/building on highly successful work on Complex Lives/City Centre Management.
- 12. Within the broader Locality there is a focus on the specific assets, strengths, needs and delivery issues in the key towns and villages of Doncaster. This will be reflected in town/village/neighbourhood level approaches, in engagement and representation and in delivery arrangements where feasible and appropriate.
- 13. The four Locality boundaries are outlined here.
