### Box 2 DECISION TAKEN:

To accept £36,448k of WREN funding to purchase and install a Woodland Adventure Park in Sandall Park.

## Box 3 REASON FOR THE DECISION:

### Give relevant background information

In July 2016, Doncaster Council, in partnership with the Friends of Sandall Park, submitted an application to WREN for funding towards a Woodland Adventure Play Park to be installed in Sandall Park at a cost of circa maximum £50k. We were successful in this application and WREN are prepared to pay £36,448k of grant towards the costs of the project. The additional costs will be covered by a £4,995 from the Mayors Fund, with the remainder covered by the Friends of Sandall Park. There is no immediate cost to DMBC.

We now need to decide to accept the funding and implement the project. Planning and all other permissions are in place.

The terms of the grant are very favourable, and give us an opportunity to do something that would not be possible otherwise.

We could decide not to accept the grant, but there are no other resources available so the scheme would have to be cancelled, and this would run contrary to considerable expectation from both the very active Friends Of Sandall Park group and senior management that the scheme will go ahead.

This is also the last opportunity DMBC will have to get any funding from WREN, as the recycling plant nearest to us is closing, so the Doncaster area will no longer be eligible to apply.

Section 1 of the Localism Act 2011 provides the Council with a general power of competence, allowing the Council to do anything that individuals generally may do. Section 111 of the Local Government Act 1972 gives an Authority power to purchase goods and services.

#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

#### Capital

The cost of the scheme to install a Woodland Adventure Park at Sandal Park is estimated to be £43,774 including VAT with the exclusion of any contingency being allocated for this project.

This will be funded from: -

- £36,448 WREN grant funding, with approval to accept this grant requested as part of this ODR.
- £4,995 agreed from the Mayors fund held within the Authority.
- £2,331 agreed to be contributed by the Friends of Sandall Park.

Should any overspend occur on the project this will need to be found from the Streetscene revenue budget.

The project is capital in nature and will be a new addition to the R & E Capital Programme, which requires approval by the CFO and service Director, in consultation with the relevant Portfolio Holder. Any changes will be reported to Cabinet on a quarterly basis.

The value of the Wren Grant applied is below £50,000 so a business case does not need to be approved by the Management Team to accept the Grant (financial procedure rule E10). However, acceptance of the Grant is still subject to agreement with WREN's terms and conditions for distribution of Landfill Communities Fund money. The Funding Agreement is released on acceptance of the grant so the exact terms have not yet been received. The Strategy and Performance Improvement team currently advise that these are expected to be standard conditions, with claw back limited to issues with eligibility of expenditure. Once they funding agreement is received it will need to reviewed and subjected to both Financial and Legal assessment.

On approval of the report, the Capital Programme will be updated to include this project and a capital sub cost centre will be created and allocated for the projects use.
