Box 3 REASON FOR THE DECISION:

Give relevant background information

Over the past 4 years DMBC staff have delivered community winter warmth road shows across the borough of Doncaster, which have proven to be extremely successful.

Criteria for Winter Warmth Fund

The criteria are for the sessions to be delivered only in the 12 areas identified with excess winter deaths and high rates of fuel poverty. The sessions will cover signs and symptoms of cold weather exposure, how to identify and support vulnerable people, cascade the national winter campaign, and a networking session focusing on getting to know your community.

In line with the Council's direction of travel in relation to supporting the community to deliver support services in their locality, this small fund lends itself to be delivered creatively by constituted community groups. This approach will give the opportunity for community groups to deliver creative sessions that they have identified in response to community needs, thereby ensuring the offer is community led and focuses on the most vulnerable members of Doncaster. This funding is part of recurrent monies from the Better Care Fund has been funded since 2012.

Box 13 CONSULTATION

During September 2013, ten focus groups were planned in the top ten areas of excess winter deaths and fuel poverty, totalling 124 people engaged. At each session there was a facilitator, a note taker and all sessions were recorded to be transcribed later. All the community focus groups were with local consented individuals to identify the best method of engagement and resources required to give most impact during the winter. The findings from the focus groups were analysed using framework analysis and produced themes and sub themes including participant's quotes.

The focus groups findings helped to produce the criteria, information given at road shows and which winter warmth resources to be purchased. The main findings from the consultation highlighted a fear of safety, risk of falls, a need to have a community drop in to attend when feeling lonely. Also discussed was road gritting, loss of community wardens and the need to for more local police to do community walks.
