DECISION TAKEN:

To award the contract for the Healthy Living for BME Women in Doncaster to the service Changing Lives commencing April 1st 2018.

Box 3 REASON FOR THE DECISION:

On 20th June 2017, a key decision paper to approve the procurement of four public health services in 2017/18, for a contract start date of April 1st 2018, went to cabinet. One of these four services was the Healthy Living for BME Women in Doncaster service. Cabinet approved the procurement of these services and subsequently a procurement exercise was undertaken over the autumn of 2017.

As a result of an open tender process, DMBC received 1 bid from the incumbent provider for Healthy Living for BME Women in Doncaster, Changing Lives. A panel of five evaluators went through a rigorous evaluation and moderation process to assess the bid. It was agreed that Changing Lives had exceeded the quality score and demonstrated they had the capability to provide the service as described in the service specification. The bid also came within the financial package as outlined in the tender documentation.
