## Box 2 DECISION TAKEN:

To commit [redaction] + VAT to commission FMG consultants to prepare the business case for investment of monies to develop and refurbish DMBC owned leisure facilities under the management of DCLT using the Service Transformation Fund (STF 106).

## Box 3 REASON FOR THE DECISION:

DMBC, with support from Sport England and Yorkshire Sport Foundation, previously commissioned FMG Consulting Ltd to undertake a strategic review of Indoor lelsure facilities across the borough focusing on sports hall, gyms and swimming pools. Following on from the strategic review, FMG delivered an outline business case for remodelling of the DMBC leisure facility stock and offer.

A full business case should now be developed to test the assumptions from the previous work. Sport England have provided guidance of the approach we will need to take via their strategic delivery model. To follow the strategic delivery model we will need to test the existing business case and assess impact of future investment to ensure best practice is delivered - FMG Consulting Ltd is approved under a Contract Procedure Rule Walver to deliver the full business case for the Leisure Facilities Review and their fee is

#### **OPTIONS CONSIDERED & REASONS FOR RECOMMENDED OPTION:**

Option 1 - To undertake the full business case in-house.

DMBC does not have the skilled staff or capacity to undertake the work. Failing to follow the advised processes set out by Sport England will not enable us to apply for potential funding.

Option 2 - To appoint skilled and qualified consultants to test business case and undertake condition survey to enable appropriate business plan be developed to access potential funding and make improvements to the leisure facility stock.

Option 2 is recommended.
