# BOX 2 DECISION TAKEN

To tender and award of contract for provision of Infection Prevention and Control Service in the wider community of Doncaster. The contract value is £217,800 (two hundred and seventeen thousand, eight hundred pounds).

### BOX 3

### **REASON FOR THE DECISION**

Under the Health and Social Care Act (2012) local authorities have the responsibility to protect the health of their resident population. Part of this Health Protection function is Infection Prevention and Control (IPC).

Existing IPC services are in place in Doncaster to cover service users under the direct care of:

- Doncaster and Bassetlaw NHS Foundation Trust (DBHFT);
- Rotherham, Doncaster and South Humberside NHS Foundation Trust (RDASH).
- There is service provision for community infection prevention and control which is in place up to 31 March 2019 which is commissioned by Doncaster Council. The service is provided by RDASH.

A tender exercise was undertaken in November 2017 for a four year period from 1 April 2018 to 31 March 2022, but the evaluation panel was not able to award the contract for the service, as

the sole external application was considered to be unsuitable. The incumbent provider at the time, RDASH, did not apply due to concern around the financial envelop in relation to the expected workload.

A one-year direct award was sought and obtained through the Council for the period 1 April 2018 to 31 March 2019 for RDASH to continue with the provision of the service while arrangement for tendering the service for longer term was being explored. This proposal is in line with the plan in order to obtained permission to tender the service for the next 3 years, with the option of 2 years extension.

#### BOX 4

#### ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED

- 1. Discontinue the service: This will leave the most vulnerable people who need to be protected from infections in the community exposed. This option was tried in the past, and we had to re-instate the service.
- 2. Consider as part of Area of Opportunity in Doncaster Place Plan: There are limited project areas that are currently being considered as part of Doncaster Place Plan. It requires longer time in order to consider Infection Prevention and Control in the community to be one of the Areas of Opportunities. The remaining time, up to 31 March 2019 will not be adequate for this consideration.
- **3. Tender the service:** This is in line with the plan following previous failed tender, and one year extension of the service to give time for the service to be tendered out. This is the preferred option, consistent with the decision being requested.

## BOX 5 LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

Section 1 Localism Act 2011 gives the Council a general power of competence to do anything that individuals may generally do.

Section 2B of the National Health Service Act 2006 (as amended by Section 12 of the Health and Social Care Act 2012) introduced a new duty on Councils in England to take appropriate steps to improve the health of the people who live in their area.

This contract should be tendered in compliance with the Council Contract Procedure Rules.

Further legal advice and assistance will be provided is readiness for the tender process.

#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

The Local Authority receives an annual allocation of funding from Public Health England; indicative figures for 2019/20 are £2.3m. The cost of the Infection Prevention & Control contract for the next 3 years will be funded from this grant and will be taken into account during the budget setting process.

There is an expectation that the Public Health grant will reduce further in forthcoming years, therefore any extension beyond this 3 year period needs to be considered in line with anticipated budget pressures.
