#### BOX 2

### **DECISION TAKEN**

To allocate £1.43m of COVID funding secured in 2020-2021 for key areas of COVID-19 related services.

To provide grants to pump prime the Community Renewal Fund awarding grants to Refurnish Chamber, South Yorkshire Sports Foundation and Voluntary Action Doncaster £20k

To provide a grant to Expect Youth to provide COVID safe summer activity programme £25k

### BOX 3

### REASON FOR THE DECISION

During 2020/21 financial support for local authorities was made available from the Government by way of grants under section 31 of the Local Government Act 2003 to deliver key activities to respond to local outbreaks of COVID, provide containment interventions and support residents most impacted by COVID. The first tranche of funding under the heading of Test and Trace (T&T) of £2.23m was approved via a Rule 16 on 13<sup>th</sup> July 2020. Further funding was released under the heading Contain Outbreak Management Fund (COMF) £2.495m and £5.527m both approved via a Rule 16 on 9<sup>th</sup> November 2020 and 23<sup>rd</sup> December 2020 respectively. All three approvals delegated to the Director of Public Health in consultation with the Director of Corporate Resources and the Portfolio Holder for Public Health future decision making regarding these funding streams.

Under the terms and conditions of the grants underspends were permitted to roll forward in 2021/22, however the funding is ring-fenced for public health purposes to tackle COVID-19 by

working to break the chains of transmission and protecting people. Currently guidance states it must be spent by 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022. The current uncommitted balance is a combined £2m, this ODR seeks approval to allocate £1.43m for the following:

**Environmental Health Team Enforcement & Engagement £100k:** Ensure ongoing compliance, advice and engagement with retail, hospitality and licenced premises borough wide as national restrictions ease

**Neighbourhood Response Team £350k:** to cover costs of a borough wide resource for first response and dealing with group gatherings and potential business compliance and enforcement of COVID restrictions and guidance

**Neighbourhood Engagement and Response Officers £369k:** to provide targeted prevention visibility & engagement work in prioritised areas – supporting locality bronze groups with a 4 E's approach with a particular focus on high risk hot spots as identified in the visibility and enforcement plan.

**Specialist Teams & Equipment £298k:** the use of COVID funding to support vulnerable residents in Eden Lodge, Wickett Hern and Hamilton Court.

# Community Renewal Fund Pump Priming £20k:

Application submitted and awaiting decision, to pump prime the planned activities to invests in communities and place by providing our residents with targeted and bespoke support to help them combat and overcome the challenges they face on daily, with specific focus on:

- Training, Financial & Digital Exclusion
- All-Age Loneliness
- Employability
- Health & Well-Being

By providing advice, guidance, and support in these key areas, we will help those people and communities in the greatest need. It will be a holistic intervention, targeting those areas we know have the greatest challenges, and those individuals within those communities who most need help.

## Summer Activity Programme £25k

To support the delivery of positive activities to children and young people from diverse backgrounds across the borough

**DARTS £8k:** Provide additional capacity to develop a blended approach support vulnerable people and those self-isolating or shielding

**Drug & Alcohol Family Intervention £110k:** COVID funding to be used for year one of provision to provide support to adults with families where the parent(s)/carer(s) have primary alcohol/drug issues with caring responsibility for children. Year two will be funded from Public Health Grant earmarked reserve.

**Positive Steps Unit £150k:** Additional staffing costs due to staff working in cohorts for COVID infection prevention control purposes whilst supporting vulnerable residents.

#### BOX 4

### ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED

Not to approve the proposed spending plan which may result in increasing budget pressures within the Council and potentially having to return unspent grant allocations.

#### BOX 5

#### LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

Section 1 of the Localism Act 2011 gives the Council the power to do anything that individuals may generally do.

Section 111 of the Local Government Act 1972 gives a local authority power to do anything which is calculated to facilitate, or is conducive or incidental to, the discharge of any of its functions.

Financial Procedure Rules E15 – E18 should be complied with when granting funding to outside bodies to ensure that the Council's interests are protected at all times.

Legal Services should be consulted at the earliest opportunity to review any terms and conditions of acceptance of the grant funding and ensure that any obligations and in particular, clawback provisions are passed down to third party funding recipients in suitable funding agreements.

Goods and services being procured should be undertaken in accordance with the Council's Contract Procedure Rules and where applicable, the Public Contracts Regulations.

In administering the funding, specific legal advice should be sought on complying with the Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy's Technical Guidance on the UK's International Subsidy Control Commitments and Summary Guide to awarding Subsidies published on the 31st December 2020.

#### BOX 6

#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

During 2020/21 the Council received several ring fenced Government grants under section 31 of the Local Government Act 2003 to support costs associated with tackling COVID-19. Receipt of £2.23m Test and Trace Grant was approved via a Rule 16 on 13<sup>th</sup> July 2020, Contain the Outbreak Management Fund (COMF) £2.495m and £5.527m both approved via a Rule 16 on 9<sup>th</sup> November 2020 and 23<sup>rd</sup> December 2020 respectively. Government guidance confirmed that this funding could roll forward into 2021/22 but must be spent by 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022. The afore mentioned decisions all approved the delegation of further decisions from these grants to Director of Public Health in consultation with the Director of Corporate Resources and the Portfolio Holder for Public Health.

At the end of 2020/21 £7m was transferred to Earmarked Reserves, £5m of which will continue to fund work/schemes outlined in earlier decisions and £2m has since been freed up to fund new priorities as outlined in the body of the report.

This report seeks approval to use £1.43m of the £2m per Box 3. £648k (£350k + £298k) will fund existing services that have been heavily involved in managing the pandemic, this will maximise the ring-fenced grant and therefore release existing council resources which will be taken and held corporately.

Spend against these grants will be monitored in line with the terms and conditions of the grants which includes monthly financial returns to the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government.
