EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. In incredibly difficult circumstances Doncaster's care providers have maintained generally good quality over the last year according to ratings received from the Care Quality Commission. This is due to the skill and dedication of staff working within residential, domiciliary and other care settings across the Borough. Thanks are also due to Council and NHS staff who have provided direct support to Doncaster's care providers through the ongoing impact of the Covid pandemic.

3. The Panel are asked to note and comment on both the support provided to Doncaster's care providers during the Covid pandemic, and also the quality demonstrated by care providers in relation to ratings given by the Care Quality Commission (CQC).

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR THE CITIZENS OF DONCASTER?

4. Safe and good quality adult social care services support the health and wellbeing of Doncaster people who receive them and provide both practical help and peace of mind to family carers. Well-run services also provide rewarding employment opportunities for Doncaster's workforce.

BACKGROUND

- 5. The presentation attached to this report (Appendix One) illustrates the considerable pressure created for Doncaster's care providers by the Omicron variant of Covid 19. The degree of mortality from this variant has been significantly lower than from previous waves, thanks to high uptake of vaccination and also to wider commitment from care provider staff on infection prevention and control. The presentation also sets out the significant support provided to Doncaster's care providers by Council staff, through providing advice and guidance, through financial assistance (both from Council budgets, national government and the South Yorkshire Integrated Care System) and through assistance managing Covid outbreaks alongside NHS colleagues.
- The presentation also shows the continuing strong performance from Doncaster's care providers in terms of their ratings from the Care Quality Commission and sets out the next steps planned in relation to both ongoing improvement and increased financial support.
