## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

1. The Panel is asked to consider the presentation provided at the meeting. This presentation will describe the current systems and processes in place to monitor the quality of care within NHS commissioned services. The presentation also will describe the transition from Clinical Commissioning Groups (CCG) to the new Integrated Care Board (ICB) for South Yorkshire with a particular focus upon Quality Surveillance, Quality Assurance and Quality Improvement. The presentation is designed to provide information and context for local system leaders to facilitate discussions around system wide quality improvements. CQC inspection outcomes are only a part of Quality Assurance frameworks but as the Regulator the CQC provides a clear view on required provision.

4. Reviewing such issues ensures the Panel is responding to important issues, which ultimately have an impact on residents across the borough.

## BACKGROUND

5. The CCG undertakes Quality Surveillance and Quality Assurance on services that it commissions. The purpose is to provide assurance that services are being delivered are of sufficiently high quality and meeting the needs of the population served. In addition, this work contributes to quality improvements in services provided or contributes to the redesign and recommissioning of services. Where appropriate activity is undertaken with other key partners such as the Local Authority.
6. Subject to final legislation, the CCGs are to be replaced by the Integrated Care Boards. This is currently due to happen in July 2022. Many of the duties of the CCGs will be transferred to the ICB and this includes the work around quality. All CCGs across South Yorkshire are working to transition to the ICB. The presentation explores the emerging structures in relation to Quality and Safety and also discusses the national guidance in relation to System Quality Boards.
