| <p>Doncaster Safeguarding Adults Board (DSAB) governed by an Independent Chair and aims to safeguard adults with care and support needs in Doncaster from abuse and/or neglect and ensure they are involved and asked what they want to see happen with any safeguarding intervention. The DSAB is made up of the Safeguarding Partners (Doncaster Council (DMBC), Doncaster Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG), South Yorkshire Police (SYP) as well as relevant agencies. This includes health provider services, care homes, the fire service and voluntary, community and faith organisations.</p> <p>The DSAB are required to agree on ways to co-ordinate their safeguarding services; act as a strategic leadership group in supporting and engaging others; and implement local and</p> |

national learning including Safeguarding Adult Reviews. To do this, they need to work in partnership with all relevant agencies in Doncaster as the Doncaster Safeguarding Adults Board.

The DSAB are also required to publish an annual report at least once in every 12-month period. The report must set out what they have done as a result of its responsibilities, including safeguarding adult reviews.
