BOX 2 DECISION TAKEN

This is the third year of additional monies received as part of the 10 year National Drug Strategy entitled 'From Harm to Hope'. The Supplemental Substance Misuse Treatment and Recovery Grant (SSMTRG) from the Office of Health Improvement and Disparities (OHID) has been deployed to improve the capacity and quality of substance misuse services in line with the new national strategy.

The main focus of the strategy is to include:

- An increase in the number of people receiving high quality treatment
- Improved treatment for people rough sleeping or at risk of rough sleeping
- Lives saved through a reduction in drug related deaths
- An increase in the continuity of care for people moving from prison into treatment
- Contributing to reduction in crime through effective treatment for offenders
- An increase in the number of people in long term recovery
- An increase in the number of people in recovery who are in sustained employment

• An increase in the number of people in recovery who are in safe and stable accommodation

REASON FOR THE DECISION

This investment will further increase the capacity and quality of the existing Aspire service, enhance the professional workforce, improve integration of services, improve access to accommodation alongside treatment, improve employment support, increase referrals into treatment in the criminal justice system and keep prisoners engaged in treatment after release. It will enhance the services offered, add flexibility, decrease waiting times and enable more people to benefit from the Aspire service.

Public Health are seeking permission to go ahead the spend for the financial year 2024/25.

The SSMTRG allocation for Doncaster is confirmed at £2.4m for 2024/25 and was approved in a key decision taken on 14th June 2022 and forms part of the approved budget for 2024/25. Whilst the original key decision approved the funding allocations for the 3-year period it only set out a spending plan for the first year, this report therefore sets out the planned expenditure for the programme for 2024/25 in line with OHID's interventions set out in the grant agreement.

This is a ring-fenced grant; quarterly returns are submitted to OHID and use of the grant is monitored against the approved plan. Any underspends will be clawed back.

EQUALITY IMPLICATIONS: (To be completed by the author).

There is a strong association between socioeconomic position, social exclusion and substance-related harm in relation to both alcohol and other drugs in the general

population. People living in more deprived areas and with lower individual resources and socioeconomic capital are at greater risk of harm. The highest levels of alcohol and drug-related deaths in the UK occur in those areas of greatest neighbourhood deprivation.

The SSMTR allocation will reduce inequality with more people accessing treatment, addressing underlying health inequalities amongst the Doncaster substance misusing population.
