EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. The Joint Strategic Needs Assessment (JSNA) is a process that identifies the current and future health and wellbeing needs of a local population. For Doncaster, the JSNA is an online repository of an intelligence and insight on health, wellbeing and inequalities in Doncaster.
2. JSNAs are a mandatory requirement of the Health & Social Care Act 2012. The JSNA is a publicly available resource and is used by City of Doncaster Council, the Integrated Care Board (ICB) and wider Team Doncaster partners in service planning and in designing and commissioning services.
3. The JSNA is a continuous process, rather than an annually published document, involving 3 modules – a core JSNA, Health Needs Assessments and Focussed projects like the Fairness and Wellbeing Commission and Community Profiles.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR THE CITIZENS OF DONCASTER?

- The JSNA provides comprehensive and current health and social care intelligence to inform local policy and strategy development to improve the lives of Doncaster people. JSNA data is used in service planning and commissioning and helps external partner organisations to understand population health challenges and opportunities. JSNA data is public, supporting transparent decision making.

BACKGROUND

- The JSNA is an online repository of an intelligence and insight on health, wellbeing and inequalities in Doncaster. The JSNA is an ongoing, live process directed by an annual work plan and broadly involving 3 modules with all elements available online.









- The JSNA uses a combination of locally generated and nationally published data, which enables analysis of trends and comparison to other Local Authority areas and provides lines of enquiry for further investigation where Doncaster is an outlier. For nationally published data, there can be limitations in the timeliness of data and local insight can enrich understanding and focus.
- Insight is collated through appreciative enquiry, consultation and coproduction. Arrangements with organisations including HealthWatch also provides a rich picture of views and experiences of health and wellbeing and health services.
- An overview of the content of the JSNA modules will be provided at the HASC session on 15th July to include core JSNA data and summaries from the Fairness and Wellbeing Commission data packs and community profiles. This

will support HASC to consider topics for future focus for the Health and Adult Social Care Overview and Scrutiny Panel
