Subject Matter: Process for the Continuing Application of the Local Sites Selection Guidelines relating to Local (Wildlife and Geological) Sites (Local Plan Policy 31) and their Identification on the Local Plan Policies Map to inform decisions on planning applications.

BOX 2**DECISION TAKEN**

- a) That the Cabinet Portfolio Holder for Finance, Traded Services and Planning (or his/her successor) be delegated authority to consider recommendations from Doncaster's Local Sites Partnership, for the inclusion, removal or amendment of sites, as considered against the Council adopted [Local Site Selection Guidelines](#); changes to be then shown on the [Local Plan's Policies Map](#), and taken into account when determining relevant planning applications.
- b) Subject to the approval of (a), that the Cabinet Portfolio Holder for Finance, Traded Services and Planning (or his/her successor) determines whether to make the recommended changes set out in Appendix 1 of this report.

BOX 3**REASON FOR THE DECISION**

The reason for the decision is to provide a transparent process for the continued assessment of up-to-date evidence post Local Plan adoption. Such evidence informs changes to Local (Wildlife and Geological) Sites to which Policy 31 of the Local Plan applies, be they additional sites, amended site boundaries, or sites no longer meeting the criteria for designation. These can be incorporated on, or removed from, as appropriate, the Local Plan's [Policies Map](#); and used in helping to determine relevant planning applications.

Background Information

Local Sites designation is primarily a designation used for Town and Country planning matters to protect their biodiversity and/or geodiversity interests by acknowledging their value and making their conservation a material consideration in planning matters. Designation does not, however, affect the normal day-to-day use and management of the land.

Local Site designation is also relevant to the Council's, and other local public bodies', need to meet the statutory Biodiversity Duty (Environment Act 2021) to consider how they can conserve and enhance biodiversity through their functions, where a designated site could be affected beneficially or to its detriment.

Local Sites will also be identified as 'areas of particular importance for biodiversity' in Local Nature Recovery Strategy (LNRS) mapping, priority setting and monitoring, and this is also a timely factor driving this decision. The mapping work for the LNRS is currently underway and this decision, at this time, will enable us to provide the most up to date information to inform this work.

The last update to the Local Site series was recommended as part of the development of the Local Plan, when a number of Local Wildlife Sites (new and old) were given candidate Local Wildlife Status, reflecting the need for further investigation. Whilst the update and review of the Local Sites series is an ongoing process, it is considered timely to update the Local Plan's Polices Map now to reflect the current evidence.

Rationale for this approach (part 'a' of the decision)

The Government's National Planning Policy Framework (2023) (para 185) states that **"to protect and enhance biodiversity and geodiversity, plans should a) Identify, map and safeguard components of local wildlife-rich habitats and wider ecological networks, including the hierarchy of international, national and locally designated sites of importance for biodiversity; wildlife corridors and stepping stones that connect them; and areas identified by national and local partnerships for habitat management, enhancement, restoration or creation"**, but it does not give any policy on how to consider changes.

Neither does the relevant section of the Government's Planning Practice Guidance – paras 13 and 14 of [Natural environment – GOV.UK \(www.gov.uk\)](https://www.gov.uk/government/uploads/system/uploads/attachment_data/file/114222/natural-environment-ppg-2021.pdf) – but it does refer to the role of 'local sites partnerships' in setting clear and locally defined site selection criteria with measurable thresholds to identify sites.

In 2010 the Council adopted [Local Site Selection Guidelines](#) (criteria), following widespread consultation in 2009. The criteria provide a consistent framework to ensure that substantive biodiversity or geological value can be evidenced, to underpin the Local Sites designation. Minor updates have since been made. An abridged version of these is included as Appendix 8 to the [Local Plan](#).

Using these guidelines Doncaster's Local Sites Partnership (a group of conservation partners) assesses suggested sites, using the results of ecological surveys, and

recommends to the Council, as Local Planning Authority, which should be/remain designated for use in planning decisions.

The Partnership carries out an on-going programme of site review and assessment to make sure that the Council is working with the most up-to date picture of the City's wildlife in the decisions it makes – not just in planning matters given that the Council has a statutory Biodiversity Duty to consider how it can conserve and enhance biodiversity through its functions, and is a supporting authority for the development of the Local Nature Recovery Strategy.

Adopted Local Plan Policy 31 states that **Sites will be identified and designated by the Council and are shown on the Policies Map. Other sites, including those awaiting designation, which can be demonstrated to meet the selection guidelines for Local Sites will be afforded the same level of protection.**

This does not preclude the Policies Map from being updated to show new sites / remove deleted sites or reflect any boundary changes prior to Local Plan Review.

The explanatory text in para 10.45 to Policy 31 acknowledges that the sites shown on the Policies Map are “at a fixed point in time and it is important to note that this is a snapshot of an ongoing process of review” and states that **Any site that can be shown to meet the Local Sites selection guidelines will receive the same level of protection as a designated site but may not be shown on the Policies Map until it is updated.**

Local Plan paragraphs 10.44 and 10.45 together refer to the need to update the Local Wildlife Site series, assessing sites against the Local Site Selection Guidelines and do refer to working **with conservation partners to continuously collect and record environmental information and assess sites against the Local Site selection guidelines**”. As the Policy requires this iterative process outside of the Development Plan making process, it is considered that a formal approval process should be agreed for updating the Local Plan Policies Map with Local Site changes.

The following approval process is recommended, which mirrors the Council's approval process for adding sites to the Local Heritage List and ensures that changes can be made to the Policies Map to keep it up to date.

The recommended process for doing this is as follows.

- Changes to the Local Sites series will be recommended to the Council by the Local Sites Partnership, and may include inclusion on, removal from, or for boundary amendments to be shown on the Local Plan Policies Map.
- Proportionate consultation will be undertaken, considering the policy objectives and implications of the designation.
- A report will be taken to the relevant Council Cabinet Portfolio Holder to consider the recommendation from the Local Sites Partnership, taking into account the consultation undertaken. A report is likely to be needed annually.
- Following Portfolio Holder's decisions, the Local Plan's Policies Map will be amended.

The Local Sites Partnership operates to its own Terms of Reference (see Background Paper). This will be updated to reflect this decision.

BOX 4

ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED

An alternative to the decision taken is only to update the Local Plan's Policies Map as part of Local Plan Review – Local Planning Authorities have a duty to assess whether their adopted Local Plans should be reviewed five years from adoption. For Doncaster, this would be by September 2026 at the latest. It should however be noted that the Levelling-up & Regeneration Act 2023 proposes a number of reforms to the development-plan making system, including transitional arrangements, which means the timescales for a Review of the Local Plan may change.

However, in the intervening period, there is a risk that the absence of up to date assessed site information on the Policies Map could lead to misinformed planning decisions.

As Local Sites are to be identified as 'areas of particular importance for biodiversity' in Local Nature Recovery Strategy mapping and priority setting, this decision could also weaken the validity of this work and delivery outcomes.

BOX 5

LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

Local Plan Policy 31 envisages an iterative process to continue to assess sites against adopted criteria and update the Policies Map accordingly. The introduction of a transparent process and clear decision-making route reduces the risk of successful challenge by providing robust governance in the absence of a formal Local Plan Review.

There are benefits to both developers and the LPA in the determination of planning applications by providing clarity as to the source of the up-to-date information shown on the Policies Map.

The process is recognised as an interim measure pending the next formal review of the Local Plan.

BOX 9**RISK IMPLICATIONS:** (To be completed by the author)

A potential risk, in the absence of any relevant formal national policy or guidance on how to take account of changes to Local Site designations on the Local Plan's Policies Map, is that a landowner, or planning agent, may seek to challenge the decision if s/he considers it would negatively affect their interests. However, the decision is taken based on a reasonable interpretation, based on the advice of professional planning officer judgement, of what national and local policy and guidance there is (as documented in Box 3).

Local Sites are primarily a town and country planning designation – in effect there is nothing to stop the day-to-day management of a site or activity that does not require planning permission (subject, of course, to any other non-planning consent regime / legislation).

BOX 10**CONSULTATION**

Whilst Local Sites adopted as part of the Local Plan, via plan making and examination, are part of the wider consultation requirements for Local Plan preparation, Local Sites are not specifically consulted upon. Indeed, in many cases the owners are not known to the Council. However, the criteria used to consider whether Local Sites are of sufficient interest and quality to merit designation have been consulted upon as part of the Local Plan preparation and examination.

It is considered that there is no need to consult widely on changes post-Local Plan adoption, as Local Sites are assessed against scientifically based and robust criteria and other considerations are not relevant to their designation. However, in the interest of promoting positive land management outcomes, it is proposed that a targeted consultation approach be undertaken with known landowners.

With respect to part a) of this decision, which deals with introducing a process for making changes to Local Sites as shown on the Local Plan Policies Map, the Cabinet Portfolio Holder for Finance, Traded Services and Planning has been briefed on the proposed approach and is supportive of the decision.

With respect to part b) of this decision, the following targeted consultation has been taken.

Appendix 1.

Recommended changes to Doncaster's Local Sites series – June 2024

Doncaster Local Sites Partnership recommends that the Local Sites listed in Table 1, are amended. The amendments can be summarised as:

- A. Candidate Local Wildlife Sites (cLWS) that **DO NOT** meet the Council adopted Local Site Selection Guidelines, based on the two most recent assessments (2014 and 2019) of the whole Local Site series. These sites will be **de-designated** and will no longer be part of the Local Sites series.
- B. Candidate Local Wildlife Sites (cLWS) that **DO** meet the Council adopted Local Site Selection Guidelines, based on at least one of the two most recent assessments (2014 and 2019) of the whole Local Site series, or an individual site assessment undertaken between 2019 and 2024. These sites will be **designated** Local Wildlife Sites and will no longer have candidate status in the Local Sites series.
- C. Candidate Local Wildlife Sites (cLWS) that **DO** meet the Council adopted Local Site Selection Guidelines, based on old, or restricted survey data. These sites will **remain designated as candidate** Local Wildlife Sites in the Local Sites series.
- D. Sites identified as having substantive biodiversity value according to the national guidelines, but which have not yet been surveyed or assessed against the Council adopted Local Site Selection Guidelines. These sites will be **designated candidate Local Wildlife Sites** in the Local Sites series. See also Figure 1.
- E. Sites (either candidate Local Wildlife Sites or Local Wildlife Sites) where **boundary amendments** are proposed in line with the Council adopted Local Site Selection Guidelines, to incorporate features of substantive biodiversity value and/or reflect a land management unit. See also Figure 1.


