EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. The purpose of this report is to provide Members with an overview of the Intermediate Care – changes to current service.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR THE CITIZENS OF DONCASTER?

4. The Overview and Scrutiny function has the potential to impact upon all of the Council's key objectives by holding decision makers to account, reviewing performance and developing policy.

BACKGROUND

5. NHS Doncaster Clinical Commissioning (CCG) and Doncaster Metropolitan Borough Council have been working together to improve care and support services in Doncaster.

Local Intermediate Care services have evolved over time with funding from a number of sources. Although individual services and providers have reported good outcomes, no single organisation has had a comprehensive overview of how the care system works together as a whole. To better understand this, the Intermediate Care Review was initiated in June 2014, led by the Intermediate Care Team based within the CCG.

Intermediate Care describes short-term services that support older people or those with long term-conditions to stay at home safely when they are

unwell, or need help to regain their independence after a stay in hospital. Locally this includes community teams- Short Term Enablement Programme (STEPs) and Community Intermediate Care Team (CICT) and bed-based services- Positive Steps, Hazel & Hawthorn Wards, Mexborough Montague Hospital (MMH) Rehab Centre.

To understand the needs of Doncaster residents, the Intermediate Care Team have spent time talking to patients and those involved with their care. Within this work, the team have also conducted detailed reviews of the care pathways of 30 patients, assessed the records of over 1,000 people and asked panels of local experts to identify what services need to be offered in the future to best meet the needs of the borough's population.

The team found:

- Our current services are too complicated and difficult to navigate.
- Services are not as coordinated as they could be.
- Current services aren't personalised to the individual.
- There needs to be emphasis on proactive services, helping residents keep their independence at home.
- Challenges in the future will mean the whole workforce will have to work differently in supporting people living with dementia and cognitive impairments.

Using these findings, the team will be working with providers to design a new Intermediate Care service model for Doncaster.

In the next few weeks and months, the team will spend more time listening to patients and their carers and place this experience at the heart of our redesign programme. A range of engagement activity is being planned during the summer months of 2016
